

## **Project Proposal CSE 299 [MMR4]**

The project proposal report (6-10 pages) will consist of the following information (& format):

### **Title**

The title of your proposal should be short, accurate, and clear. A single sentence containing ten or fewer words is best. For example, “Web-GURU: Web-based Guide to Research/Project for Undergraduates.”

### **Introduction**

The introduction section should introduce the problem, its significance/motivation, and the technical approach your work will take to investigate/solve the problem.

### **Background / Related Works**

This section should present a concise review of the primary literature relevant to your proposed efforts. As such it should:

- Review of existing similar systems
- Cite the key literature sources
- Critically appraise the literature
- Be constructed to inform the reader concerning where your study fits in. It should clearly state why your project should be done.
- Based on the prior work of others (whose?) in the field
- Address flaws in previous work (again, whose?)

### **Problem Description**

Description of the problem being solved.

### **Methodology**

This section should outline your plan of work. Specific information that should be contained in this section includes

- Solutions adopted and the reasons for that
  - Detailed diagrams for the complete system and all subsystems
  - Explanation of the functioning of the complete system, and all subsystems
  - Diagrams drawn using hardware/software showing the layout of the systems
  - Figures and graphs showing inputs and outputs, as applicable
  - Tables showing input and output data, as applicable
- Information on the technical expertise as it relates to the project

### **Budget**

Approximate Cost of materials required to build the system.

### **Expected timeline of progress**

A realistic timeline, description of the specific experiments/testing that will be accomplished. The timeline should define the length of the project and provide a schedule of the completion of specific tasks approximately when during the project period.
